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Basic Safety Standards

- Strengthened requirements
 - Chapter on intervention (inc emergency planning and response, coordination between neighbouring countries) in old BSS Directive replaced with more detailed requirements
 - Requires thorough EP&R arrangements nationally
 - Follows the situation based approach introduced by ICRP (existing, planned, emergency exposure situations)
 - Fukushima lessons discussed with Member State input





Directive 2013/87/Euratom, EP&R

Strengthened requirements, a comprehensive approach, lessons from Fukushima

- Occupational exposure, em. response (Art 53,69)
- Emergency management system (Art 97)
- Emergency preparedness (Art 98)
- International cooperation (Art 99)
- Strategies for long-term (Art 100-101)
- Public information (Art 70,71)



Emergency exposure situations

- At a national level, a comprehensive approach:
 - Emergency management system
 - Assessment of potential emergency situations
 - > Emergency preparedness, response plans
 - **➤** International cooperation





Emergency management system (Art. 97, Annex XI)

- Based on assessment of potential emergency exposure situations
 - Assessment of situations and associated public and worker doses
 - Organisation and allocation of responsibilities
 - Reliable, effective communication, cooperation, coordination at national/international levels
 - Public information, involvement of stakeholders
 - Emergency plans



Emergency Preparedness (Art. 98

- Prepare emergency response plans
 - Based on an assessment of potential emergencies
 - Content of plans defined
 - Plans to be tested, reviewed, revised (inc emergency exercises)
 - Provision for transition from emergency exposure situation to existing exposure





Emergency Plans (Annex XI)

- Elements to be included
 - Defined protection strategies for different postulated events
 - Reference levels for public and occupational exposure
 - Arrangements for coordination between organisations
 - Prompt implementation of protective measures, based on prevailing conditions
 - Review and revision of plans





Public information(Art.70,71)

- Information provision
 - Prior information on health protection to the public likely to be affected in the event of an emergency
 - Prompt information on protection measures in case of an emergency to those actually affected





International Cooperation (Art 99

- Strengthened cooperation between Member States and with 3rd countries
 - Arrangements to include organisations in neighbouring countries (eg facility near border)
 - Cooperation with other MS and third countries who may be affected
 - Sharing the assessment of the emergency, coordinating protective measures, public information





Strategies for long term(Art.100,101)

- Existing exposure situations
 - ➤ Establish strategies for managing existing exposure situations and for longer term
 - Evaluate exposures and provide for remedial and protective measures
 - Determine objectives and effectiveness
 - Provide information to exposed population on potential health risks and exposure reduction



Nuclear Safety Directive Amendment Directive 2014/87/Euratom

- Reinforced requirements
 - Independence and role of national regulatory authorities (Art 5)
 - EU-wide safety objective (Art 8a)
 - Defence-in-depth, accident prevention mitigation (Art 8b,d)
 - Consistency, continuity on-site EPR and the BSS provisions (Art 8d)
 - European system of topical peer reviews (Art 8e)



Directive 2014/87/Euratom: On-site EP&R

To prevent and mitigate accident

Licence holders

Member States

Emergency procedures and arrangements

Organisational structure

- Consistent and exercised
- Updated and reviewed regularly
- Ensuring sufficient staff, equipment, other resources

Clear responsibilities / coordination between:

- Licence holders
- C Authorities and organisations





Council Conclusions EP&R (Dec 2015)

- Importance of coherent protective measures along adjacent national borders,
- Invites MS's to cooperate closely on EP&R especially when emergency planning zones extend beyond the borders of a Member States,
- ➤ Take account of expert work on cross-border approaches when transposing and implementing the provisions of Council Directive 2013/59/Euratom,
- MS's to intensify their efforts for joint training sessions and emergency exercises,
- Maintain and develop, bilateral arrangements for better cross-border coordination of protective measures





Council Conclusions EP&R

- EC and BSS Directive
 - ➤ Transposition and implementation of Council Directive 2013/59/Euratom gives an opportunity to improve coherence of EP&R in the EU,
 - ➤ EC to organise workshops to facilitate the consistent transposition and implementation of Council Directive 2013/59/Euratom, aiming at developing a coherent approach to EP&R provisions of the directive





Basic Safety Standards

- Follow up of the transposition and implementation is a priority for Commission services
- Pre-transposition phase:
- EC to facilitate the process, by organising workshops, MS meetings, bilateral discussions, supporting work of expert groups, international organisations, research activities
- Aim to promote common approaches, share good practices, raise issues that require attention and identify further work





Basic Safety Standards

- ➤ Goal: Timely transposition and proper implementation
- 2018: Legal and technical conformity checks on MS's national legislation and administrative provisions will start
- >>2018: Monitor the implementation of the BSS with a focus on the new provisions






RiskAudit Survey 2015


- ➤ Initial survey to collect general information on Member States' strategies and plans for transposition and implementation
- > Followed by topical surveys including EP&R



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RiskAudit EP&R survey 2015

- ➤ Which areas needing clarification/guidance? Example: Reference levels (Article 7)
- "Practical implementation (protection strategies)
- The link between reference values, dose restrictions and operational intervention levels should be clarified"
- "Existing exposure situations"
- > Promote DS474 (Termination) at European level



Developing 'guidelines' for more consistency

- On-going study (VNS-Belgium) to identify priority topics and the basis of guidelines at the EU-level to support a more consistent approach to BSS implementation
- Council Conclusions, findings of ENCO and RiskAudit survey provide the background for this VNS study
- This study aims to review existing international standards (IAEA), views of expert groups to identify "guidelines" to support common approaches
 - Protection strategies, optimisation approaches, reference levels,
 - Generic criteria, operational criteria, default triggers,
 - Transition from emergency to existing exposure situation,
 - Emergency response arrangements and information to the public
